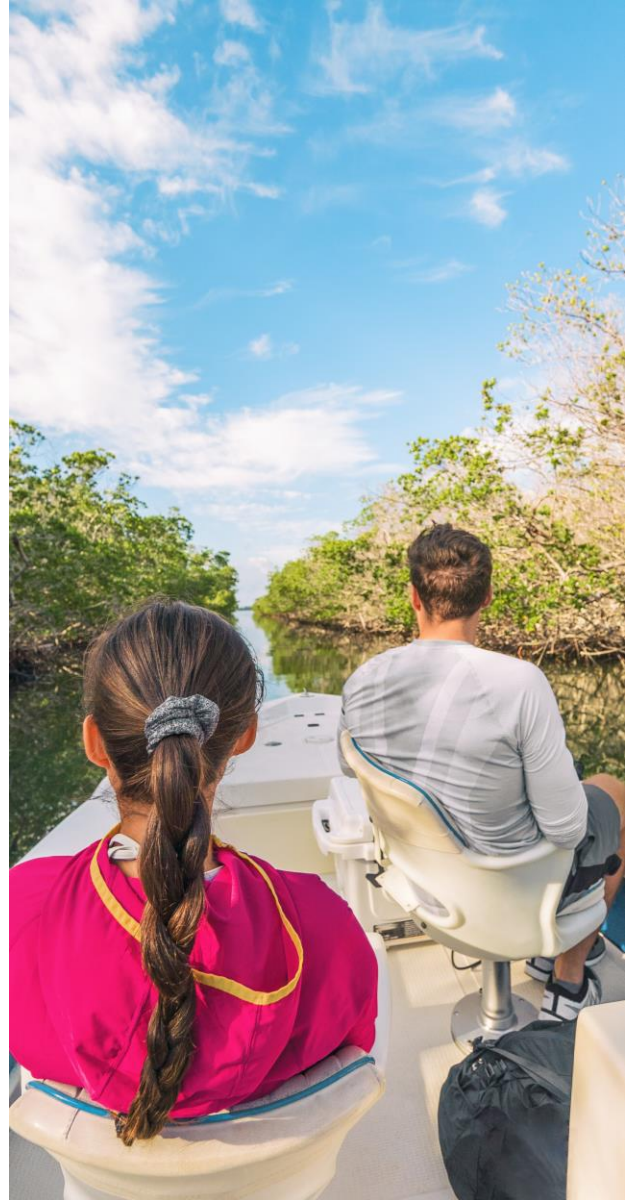

GOLDEN HOUR AT CASCO VIEJO



GAMBOA WILDLIFE EXPEDITION

Delve deep into the heart of Panama's biodiversity heaven as you journey through the Discovery Rainforest Center, situated along the renowned Pipeline Road— a global bird-watching hotspot. Wander across exotic trails and get up close and personal with a stunning array of wildlife, from vibrant birds and elusive mammals to enchanting amphibians. Ascend a 40-meter tower for canopy views of iconic birds and explore a lake platform for sightings of wattled jacanas, least grebes, herons, and snail kites. After this rainforest immersion, enjoy a canal boat ride, observing colossal ships and wildlife along Gatun Lake.





You'll start this captivating expedition visiting the Rainforest Discovery Center situated along the famed Pipeline Road, globally renowned for bird watching. This location holds a notable record set by the Audubon Society in 1985, identifying 385 bird species in a 24-hour count. Guided by a naturalist, your adventure commences in Gamboa town, trekking the pipeline road to access the Rainforest Discovery Center. You'll traverse through emerald green trails to spot vibrant displays of manakins, elusive anteaters, and striking trogons and ascend a 40-meter tower for canopy views of birds, such as the iconic blue cotinga and toucans. You'll also stop at a lake platform to view aquatic birds, such as wattled jacanas, least grebes, herons, and snail kites. Following this rainforest immersion, embark on a boat ride northbound along the canal, offering proximity to the large ships transiting the canal daily. Navigate the forested banks of Gatun Lake, a protected area, and observe capuchin monkeys, three-toed sloths, and howler monkeys. Conclude this extraordinary experience with a delectable lunch in a rural setting with scenic views of Gatun Lake.

Included: Transportation from/to Panama City, English speaking naturalist guide, boat ride, entrance fees, and lunch.

Duration: Half-day tour

What to Bring: Hiking shoes, long pants, camera, binoculars, hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, insect repellent, water.

EMBERA CULTURAL IMMERSION

Engage in meaningful conversations with Embera Quera locals, unraveling the nuances of their lifestyle and deep connection with ancestral lands. This immersive experience promises a harmonious blend of cultural exploration and appreciation for the pristine beauty of Panama's indigenous heritage.







Embark on an immersive cultural journey that transports you into the heart of indigenous Panama. Setting out towards Colon and Buena Vista, your adventure begins as you board a traditional handcrafted dugout canoe navigating the meandering Gatun River. Upon arrival, the Embera Quera tribe, which lives in perfect harmony with Mother Nature, extends a warm welcome at the wooden pier. The village's chief captivating narrative will unveil the tribe's traditions, cultural heritage, beliefs, and masterful handicrafts. Savor a traditional lunch crafted by Embera women, featuring delectable fresh fish and plantains. In the afternoon, time-travel through mesmerizing Embera dances and explore a vibrant handicraft market, offering an opportunity to contribute to children's education and the community's sustainability.

Included: Transportation from/to Panama City, English speaking naturalist guide, and local lunch.

Duration: 6 hours.

The causeway was built with rocks extracted during the construction of the Panama Canal and extends 6 kilometers into the Pacific Ocean, connecting the mainland with the islands of Naos, Perico, and Flamenco. Formerly a military base, this area now hosts restaurants, shops, and clubs, creating a vibrant atmosphere for both residents and tourists. As you navigate the route along Panama's coastal beltway, you'll gain a unique perspective of the city and marvel at breathtaking vistas of the Pacific Ocean and the cityscape.

Included: Transfer from your hotel, bilingual tour guide, bike, safety gear, and refreshments.

PANAMA CANAL RAILWAY

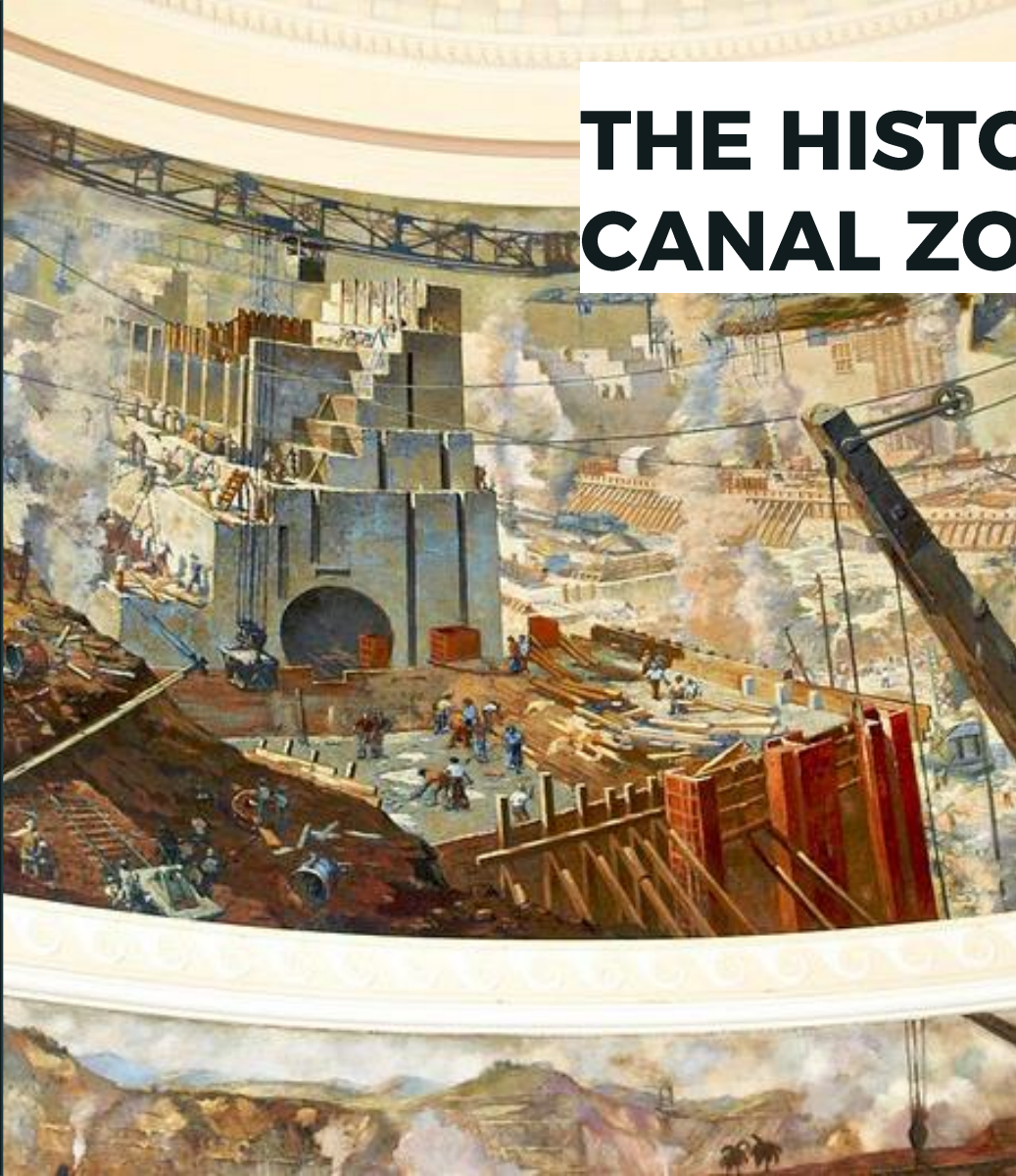

THE HISTORIC PANAMA CANAL ZONE

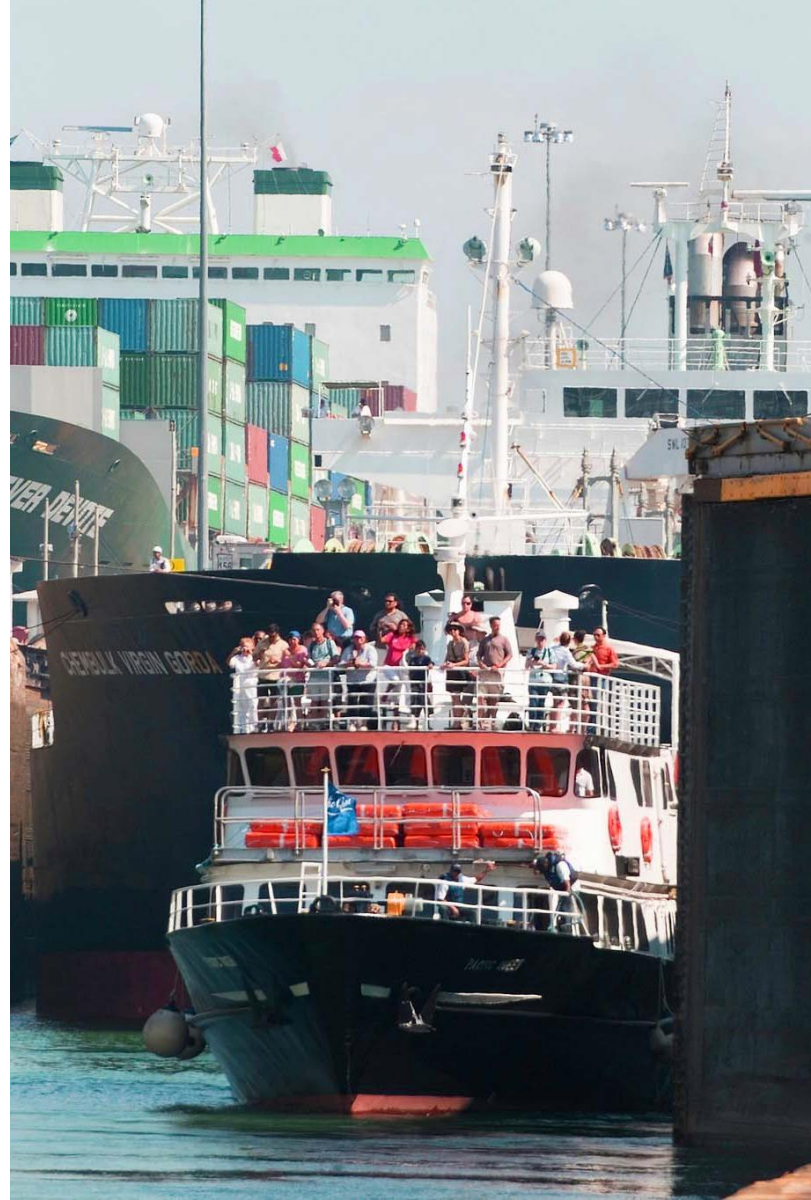

BIOMUSEO GUIDED TOUR

Research Panama's impressive history and biodiversity at Biomuseo. Nestled along the scenic Amador Causeway, this architecturally striking museum, designed by renowned architect Frank Gehry, beckons you to embark on an immersive journey through the isthmus's rich natural history. Discover the interconnected web of life that bridges North and South America, unravel the geological forces that shaped the region, and witness the extraordinary flora and fauna that call Panama home. With engaging exhibits, interactive displays, and a captivating narrative, Biomuseo promises an enlightening and enjoyable experience for visitors of all ages, offering a deeper understanding of the fascinating ecosystems that make Panama a biodiversity hotspot.





Explore the geological wonders that shaped our world and delve into the transformative impact the isthmus had on oceans, currents, climate, and continents three million years ago. This captivating narrative unfolds within the walls of the Biomuseo, a creation by the renowned architect Frank Gehry, marking his sole work in Latin America and the tropics. Gehry's design skillfully narrates the story of how the Panama isthmus emerged from the sea, connecting two continents, dividing a vast ocean, and permanently altering the planet's biodiversity. Spanning 4,000 square meters, the Biomuseo houses eight permanent exhibition galleries meticulously crafted by Bruce Mau Design. The permanent exhibition seamlessly blends art and science, guiding visitors through a marvelous journey of discovery. Situated on the Amador Causeway, the Biomuseo also provides panoramic views of the modern city skyline, the historic district, Ancon Hill, and the Bridge of the Americas.

ZIP LINE IN THE NATURE

Glide through the treetops of centuries-old forests, high above the rivers and pristine waterfalls that make up the incredible collection of natural landscapes that border La Amistad National Park and the famous Barú volcano.

ZIP LINE IN THE NATURE





Glide through the treetops of century-old forests, high above the pristine rivers and waterfalls that make up the incredible collection of natural landscapes bordering the National Park La Amistad and the famous Baru volcano. The zipline has a length of 2 miles (3 km.) and it is divided into 12 cables and 14 platforms built in the middle of the cloud forest. Who would have thought that a technology utilized hundreds of years ago by our indigenous people and later perfected by botanists and naturalists to observe and study the behaviors of wild creatures in their natural habitat, would be transformed into one of the most revered extreme sports? A harness, an ultra-resistant steel cable and gravity are the only elements necessary to suspend and propel the fearless rider in this incredible adrenaline rush.

Included: Transportation, naturalist bilingual guide, entrance fee, and safety equipment.

COFFEE TOUR

Learn the entire bean to cup process and you will never look at your morning cup the same way.

The country produces traditional shade-grown-coffee varieties .





Did you know that Panama produces some of the most flavorful coffee in the world? A relatively new player on the gourmet coffee market, the country produces traditional shade-grown coffee varieties that are generally considered to be more complex and distinctive than those produced by its more famous neighbor, Costa Rica. Most coffee plantations in Panama are concentrated around Boquete because of the high altitude required for prime coffee growing, and because of the region's fertile volcanic soil. On this tour, you will learn about the cultivation and process of the coffee bean and you will never look at your morning cup of joy the same once you have taken a coffee tour.

Included: Transportation from the hotel, English speaking driver/guide, and entrance fees.

HACIENDA MAMECILLO CULINARY EXPERIENCE

Many curiosities await you. Do you know what leaf will change any acid into a sweet? Visit a collection of crops, pick a recipe, and harvest your own food to be prepared for you.

Experience a wide explanation of coffee plantations and have a great tasting afterward.





The Chamorro-Carlsson family opens the gates of their hacienda to attend exclusively to you and make you feel like their guests.

Upon arrival at the farm there will have a welcome and a tour around the greenhouse, and trout pond, then start dinner. It will include live cooking as part of the Experience of the farm-to-table Dinner, including fresh fruits and veggies from the farm season, organic salads, and meat from the farm – pork, and chicken.

After enjoying the Dinner, we will pass to the coffee process. After this, we will be ready to roast coffee in our own roasting machine and taste the coffee, of course!! We will also show how to use the coffee skin to make and try an amazing infusion.

STARFISH BEACH, BOCA DEL DRAGO AND BIRD ISLAND



A short boat ride to Bird Island to observe a wide variety of marine life and birds that migrate to the region each year. The mainland coast and the mountain regions of Panama serve as an exquisite background for photo opportunities. You will then venture to Boca del Drago for swimming, snorkeling and lunch at the beach. Enjoy the white sand beach and culture that this location has to offer. The full afternoon will be spent at Starfish Beach and a chance to see starfish in the sea. You will go to a beautiful area called the Playa Estrella "pool" for swimming, snorkeling and nature watching.

STARFISH BEACH, BOCA DEL DRAGO AND BIRD ISLAND
